**Pleased To Crush Him**

There is a section of four "Suffering" poems in the last part of the book of Isaiah. They describe a person whom God calls Servant who goes through some terrible ordeal, seemingly without any reason. In today's poem, God states the purpose of the torture--to "justify" or restore the people's relationship with God. The author seems to be describing either a stereotype of any righteous sufferer or the people of Israel taken as a whole. The Church interprets these passages as prophecies about Jesus, the Servant of all.
