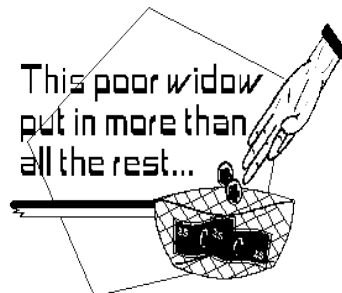

The Widow & the Collection

Jewish people have always been very generous to the poor. In the time of Jesus collection boxes outside the Temple were containers with large horns, like old-fashioned phonographs. Proceeds from these boxes, called "Trumpets," helped provide food and other assistance. The custom was to drop money in each as an offering to God. One elderly woman places in a few shekels, a trifling amount. Jesus cites her example to the apostles. The widow's offering may be small, but it is all that she has. Christ contrasts it with the larger donations given by the rich. Their gifts are small compared to their wealth.
