Paul makes an analogy between the Crossing of the Red Sea and Christian Baptism. He talks about the cloud — a symbol of God's presence — which overshadowed the Israelites and the sea water. They were sort of a baptized into Moses. This means that they were immersed into the life that God sent them through Moses. As Christians we enter into God's presence by baptism in which we are immersed in Christ. Paul's point is that some of those who followed Moses later fell away through sin. As followers of Jesus, we could meet the same fate, unless we remain strong in our faith.
